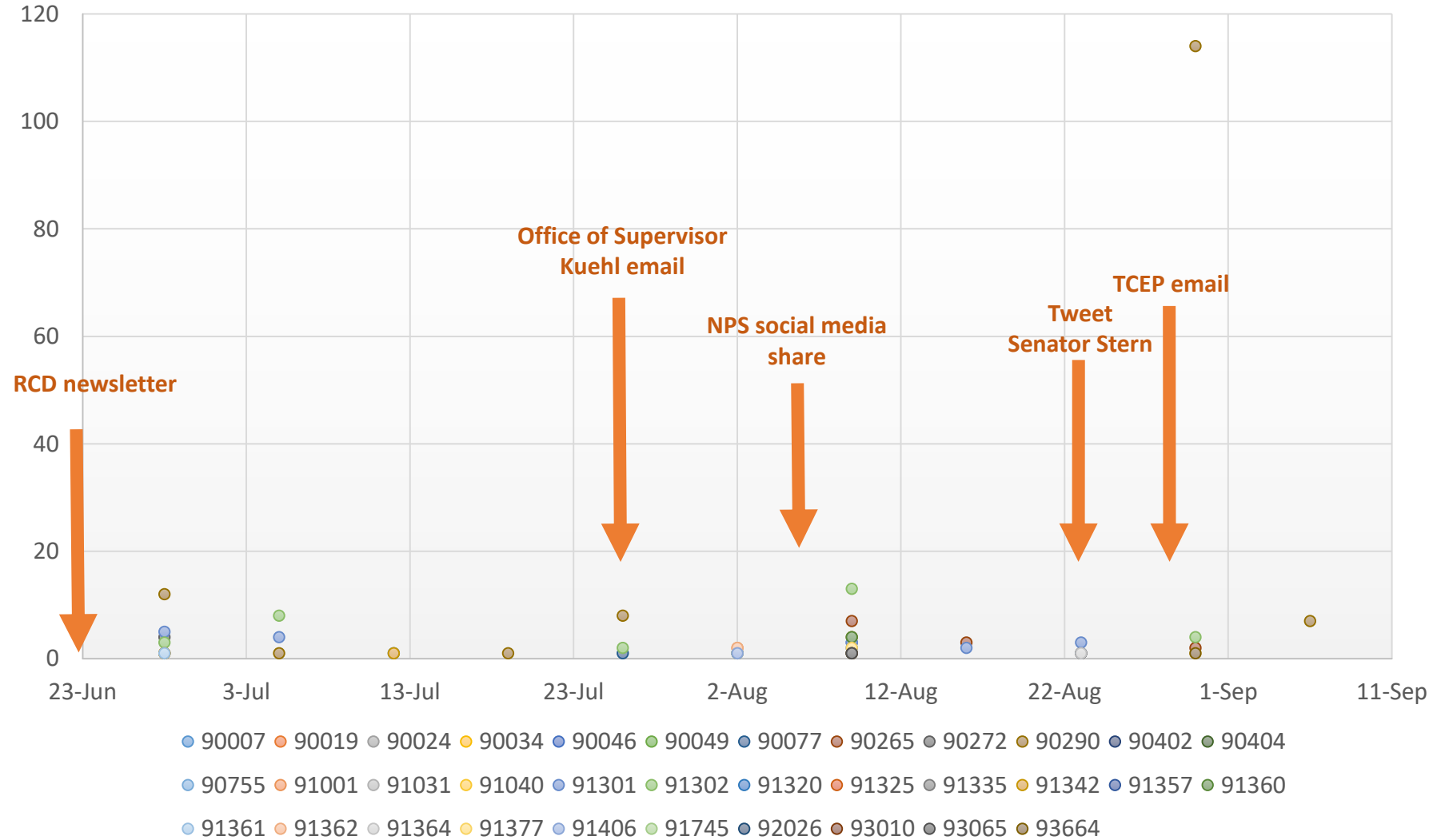
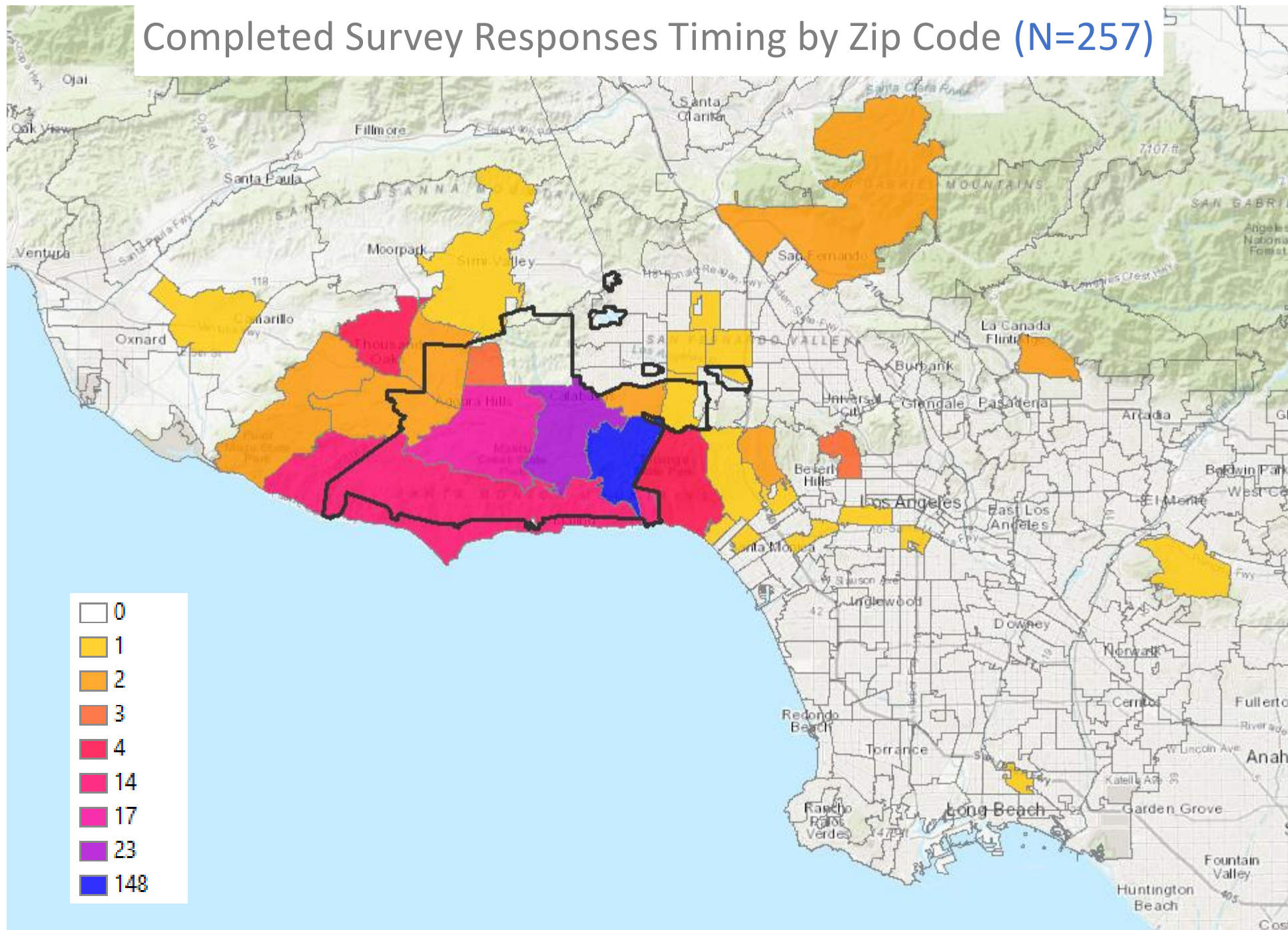


All Survey Responses Timing by Zip Code (N=321)



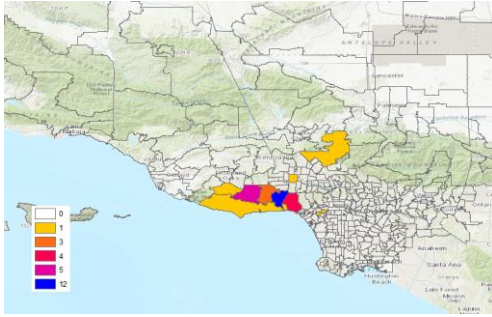
Completed Survey Responses Timing by Zip Code (N=257)



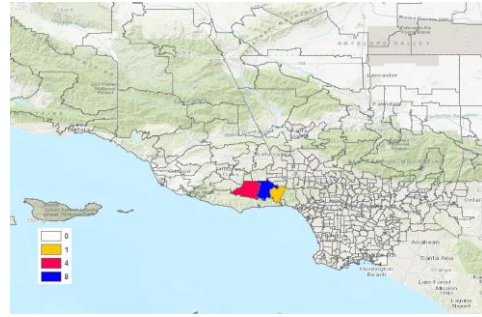

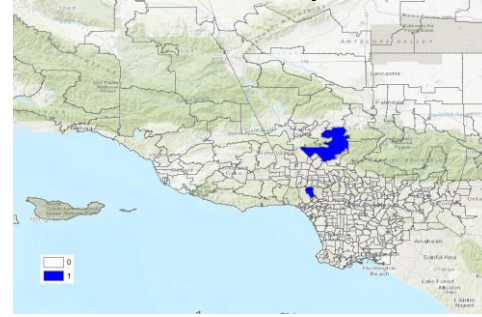

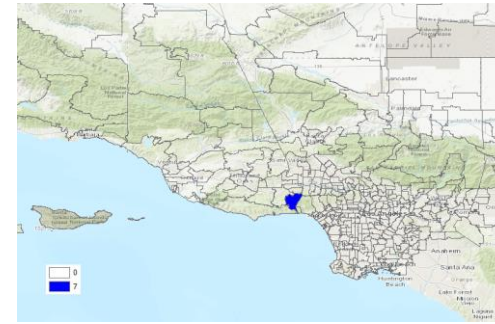

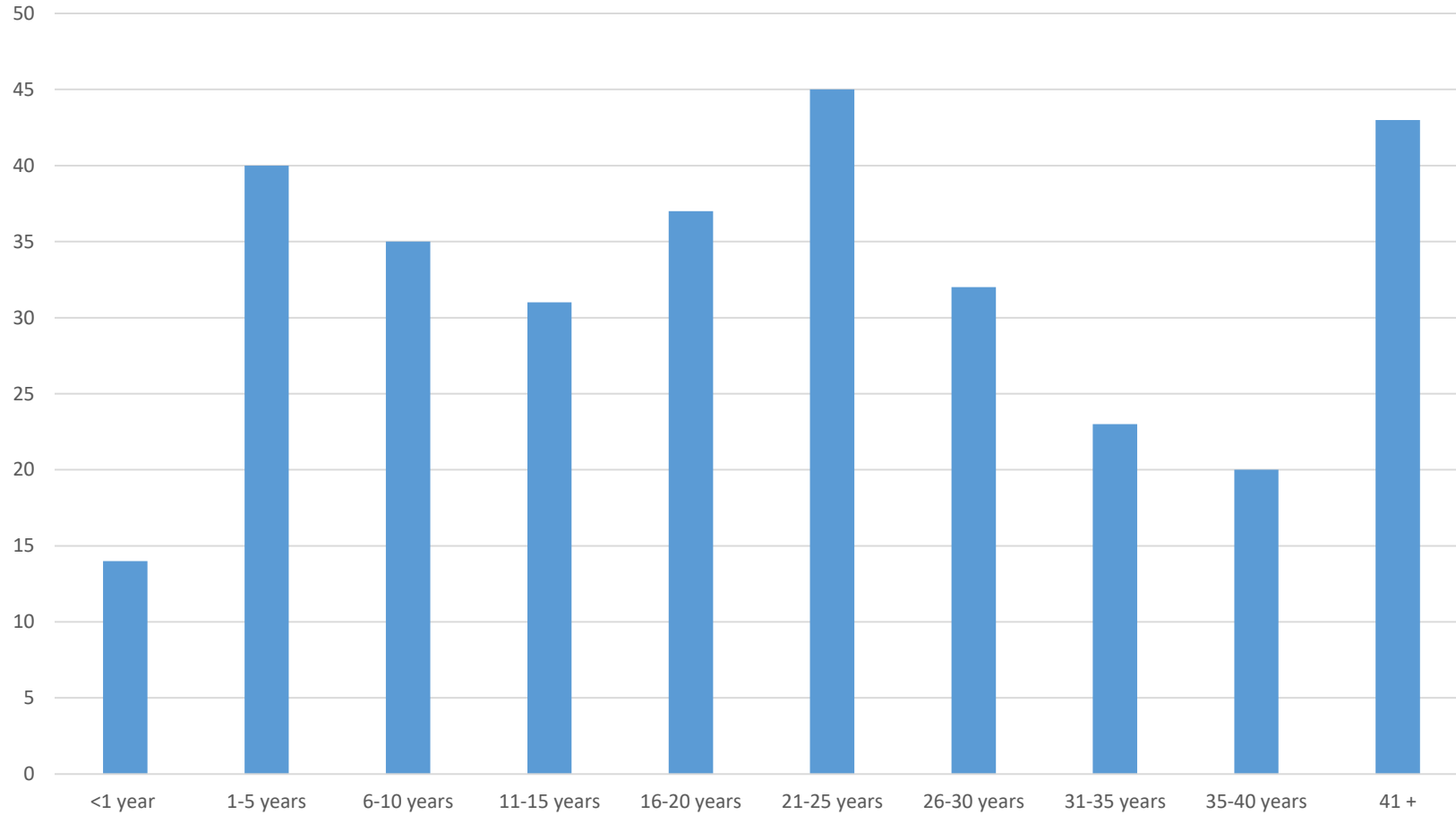

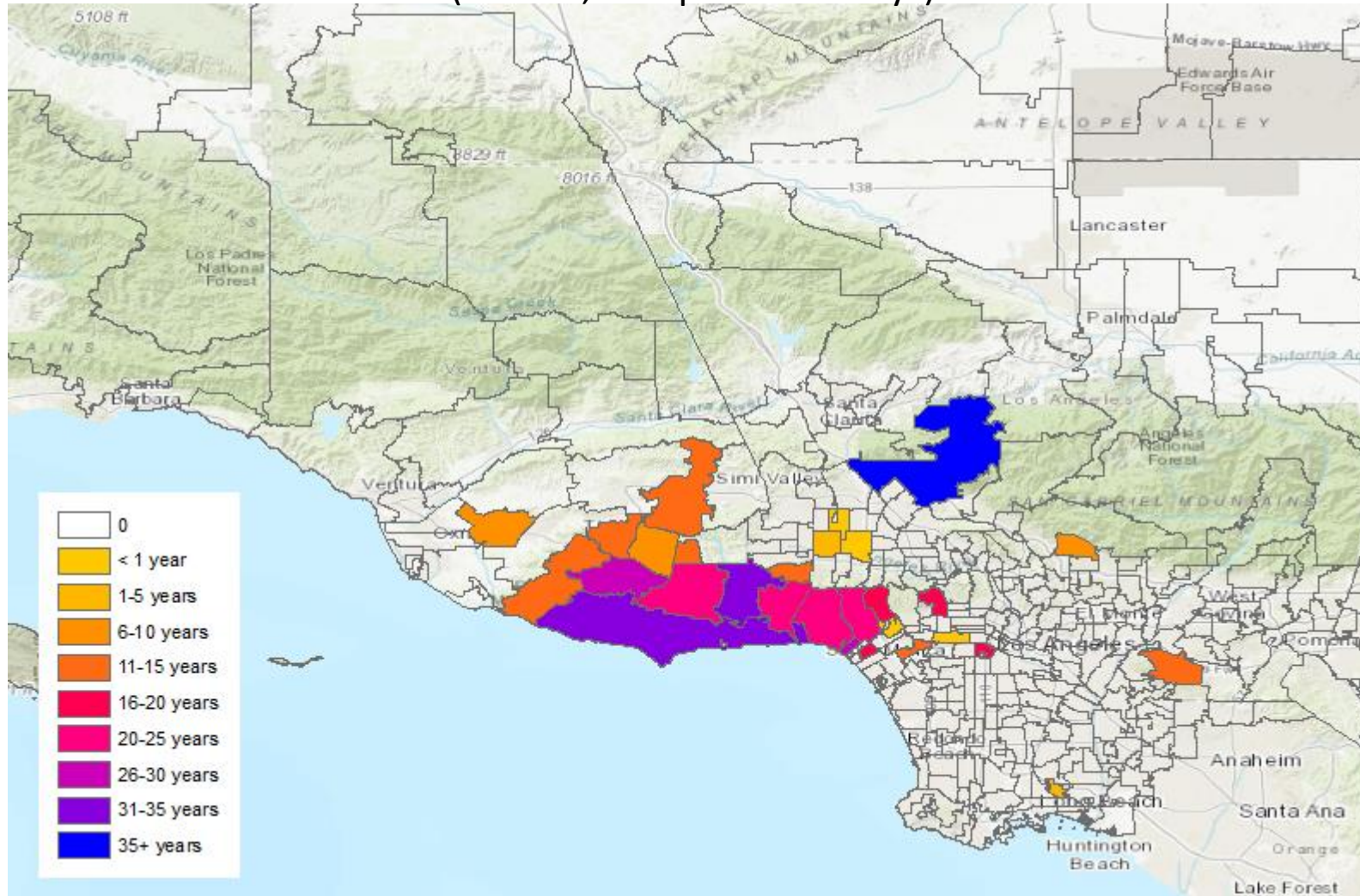

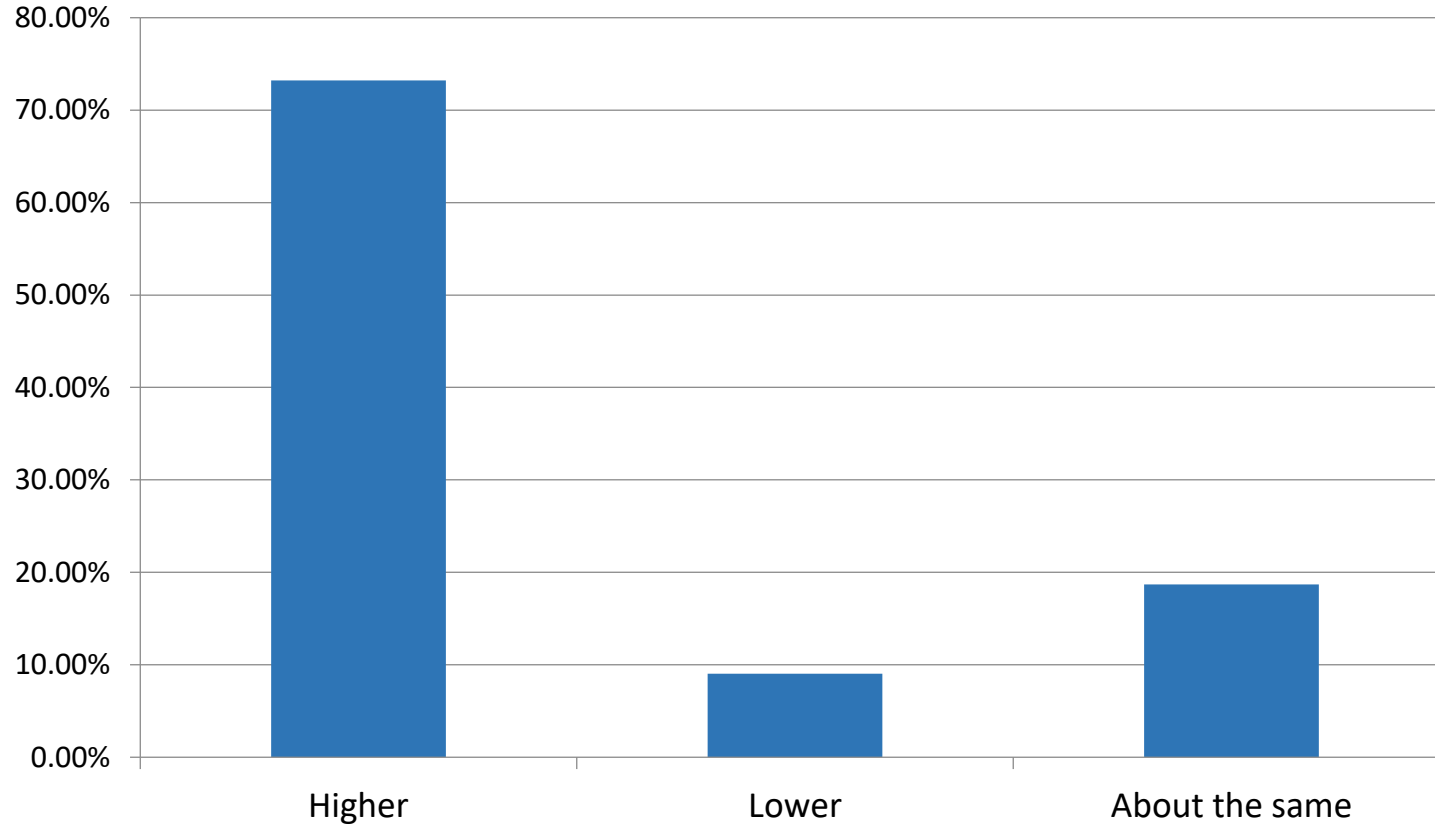
How many years have you lived in a high fire risk area? (N=321, All Surveys)

Change in external factors with minimal control (environment)

- Drought (drier conditions and less rain)
- Fires (more frequent, faster, longer, stronger)
- Climate Change (Altered fire regime, fire storms)

Personal or community actions that made difference

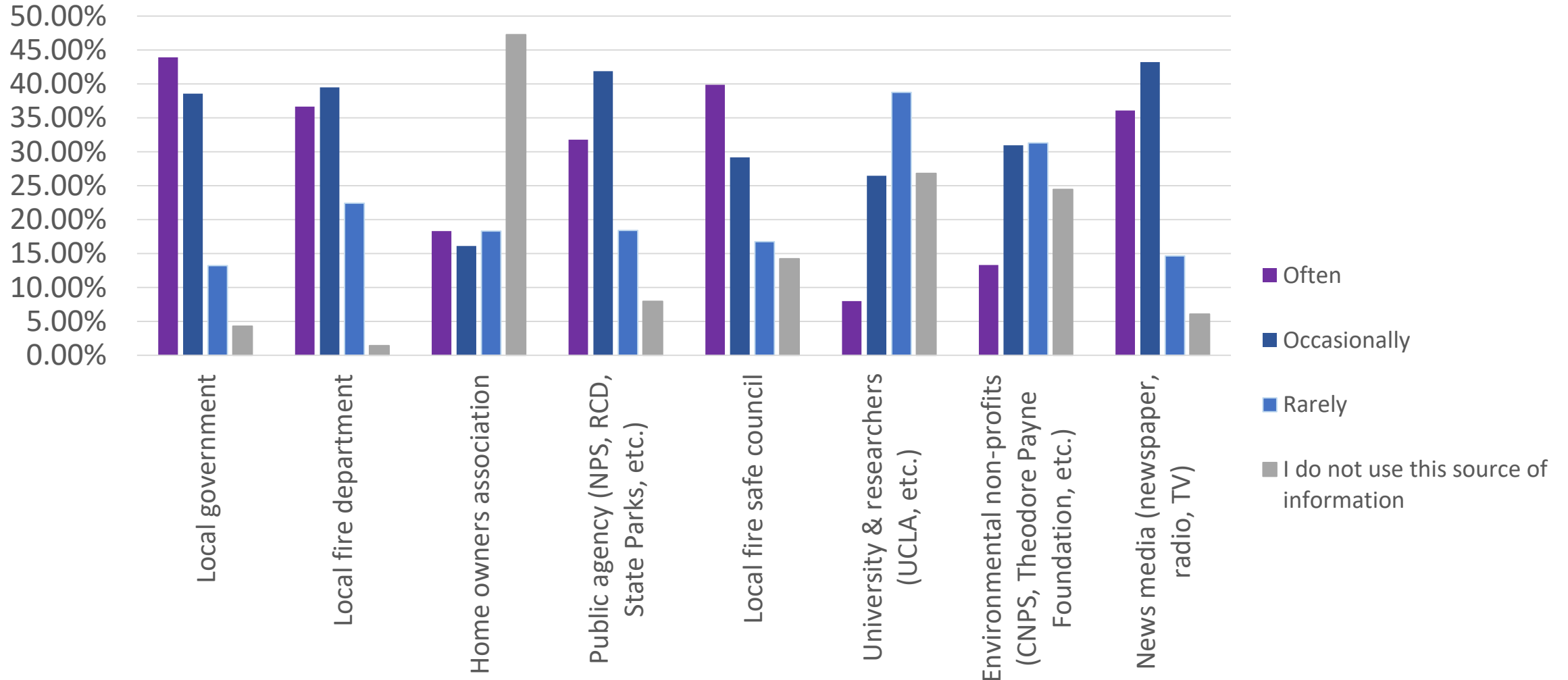
- Home hardening completed
- BRAVO 69 (water-dropping firefighting helicopters)
- Clearing plants and debris around the house
- Firefighting equipment (water pumps/generator)
- Better prepared
- Firefighters more knowledgeable and better equipped

External factors that could be worked on by community or local government

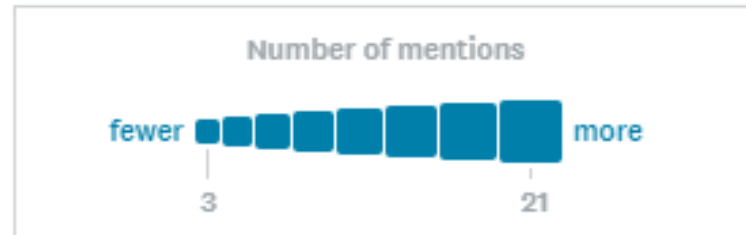
- “Others” not being careful
- New people putting in wrong plants
- More people living in the area and more traffic
- Overgrown forests and dry vegetation
- Lack of controlled burns (SMMC has not done any brush clearing in last 9 years)
- Arson/illegal camping/homeless
- Difficult fire truck access due to parked cars and buildings
- Houses located in vulnerable areas surrounded by heavy vegetation
- Un-occupied areas that are un-cleared

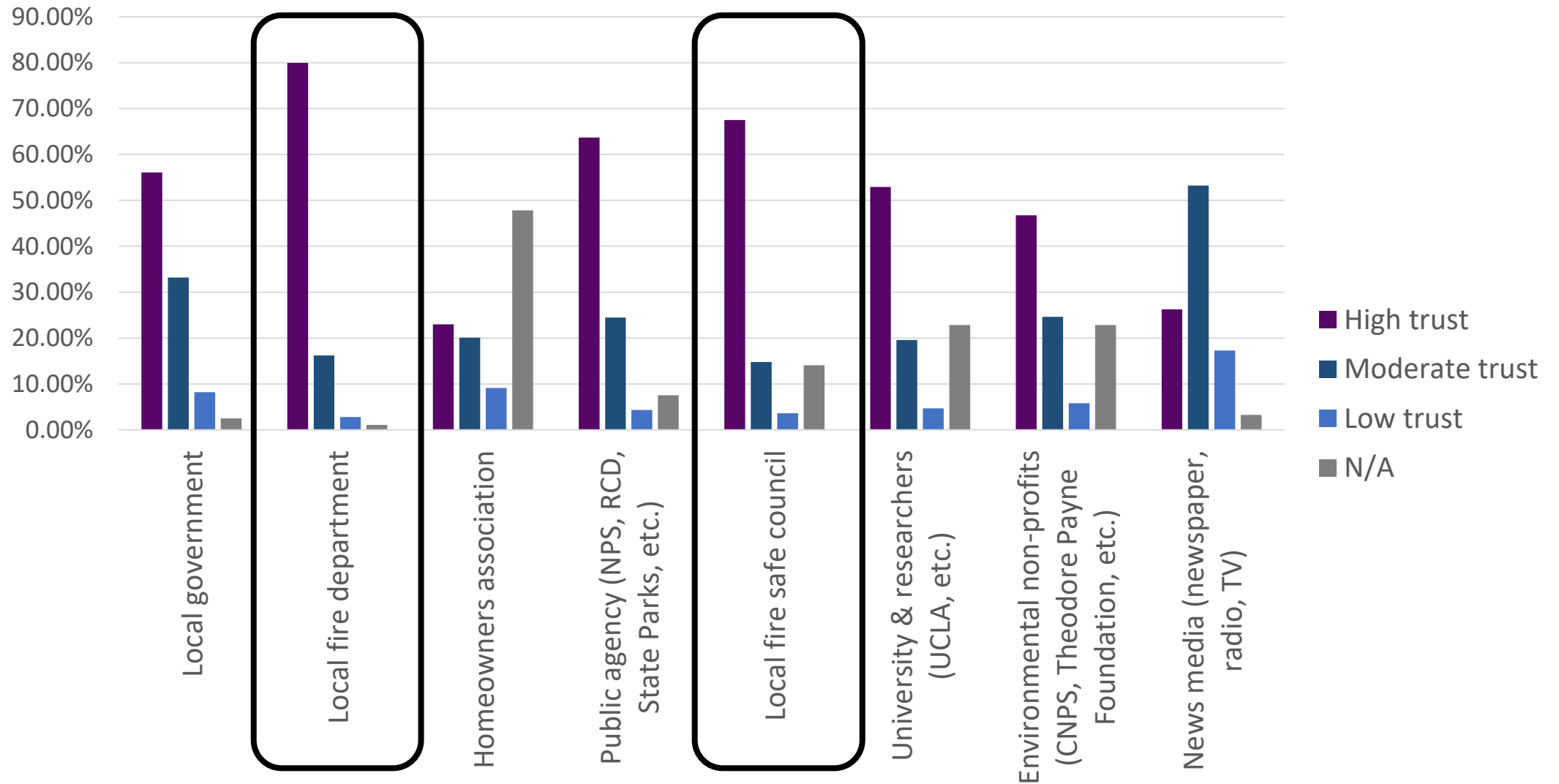
Where do you get your information about wildfire preparedness and how frequently?

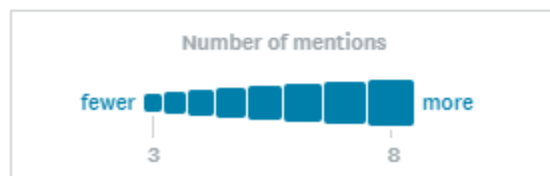

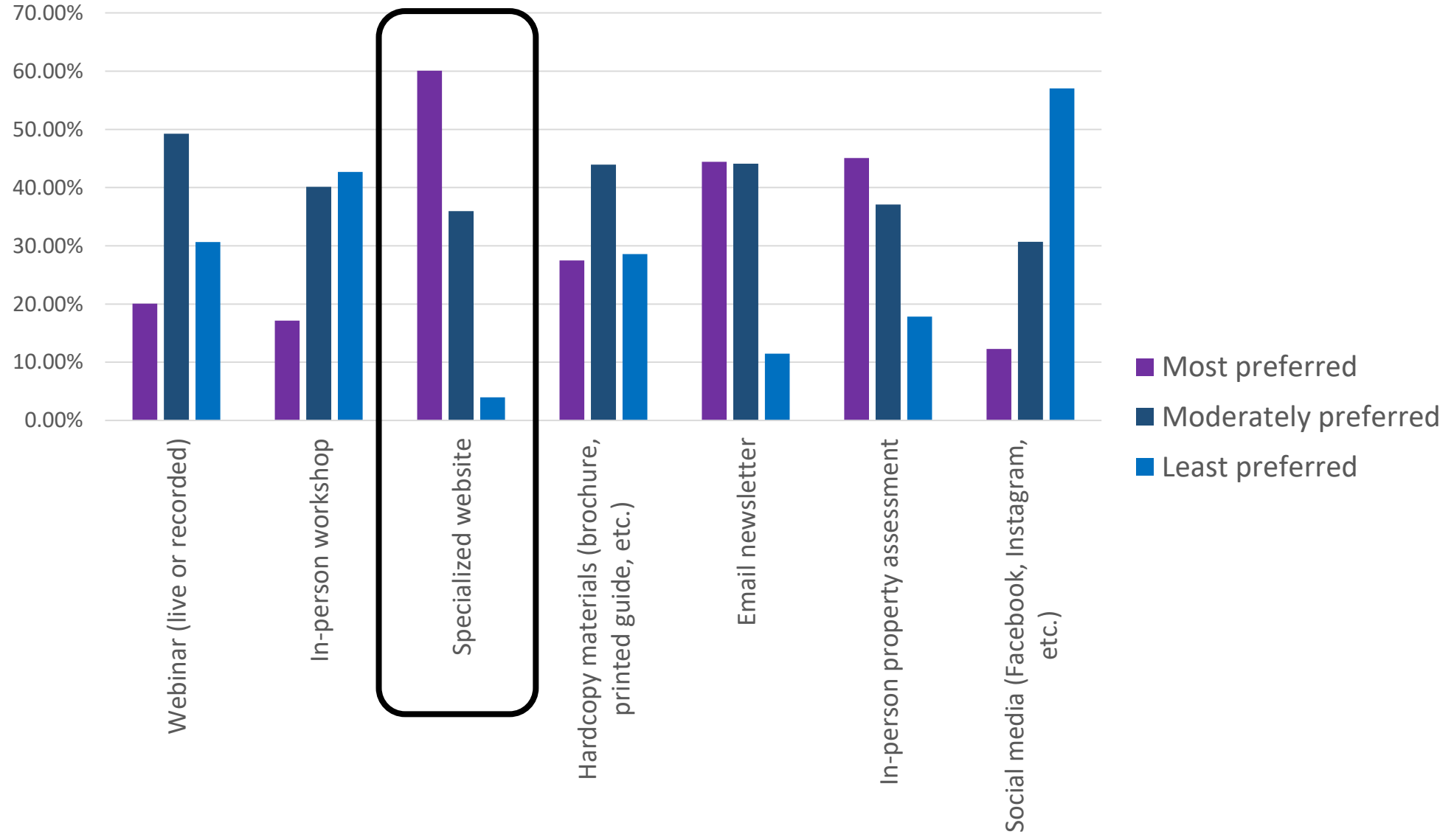
To what degree do you trust information/advice about wildfire preparedness from each of the following organizations? (N=284)

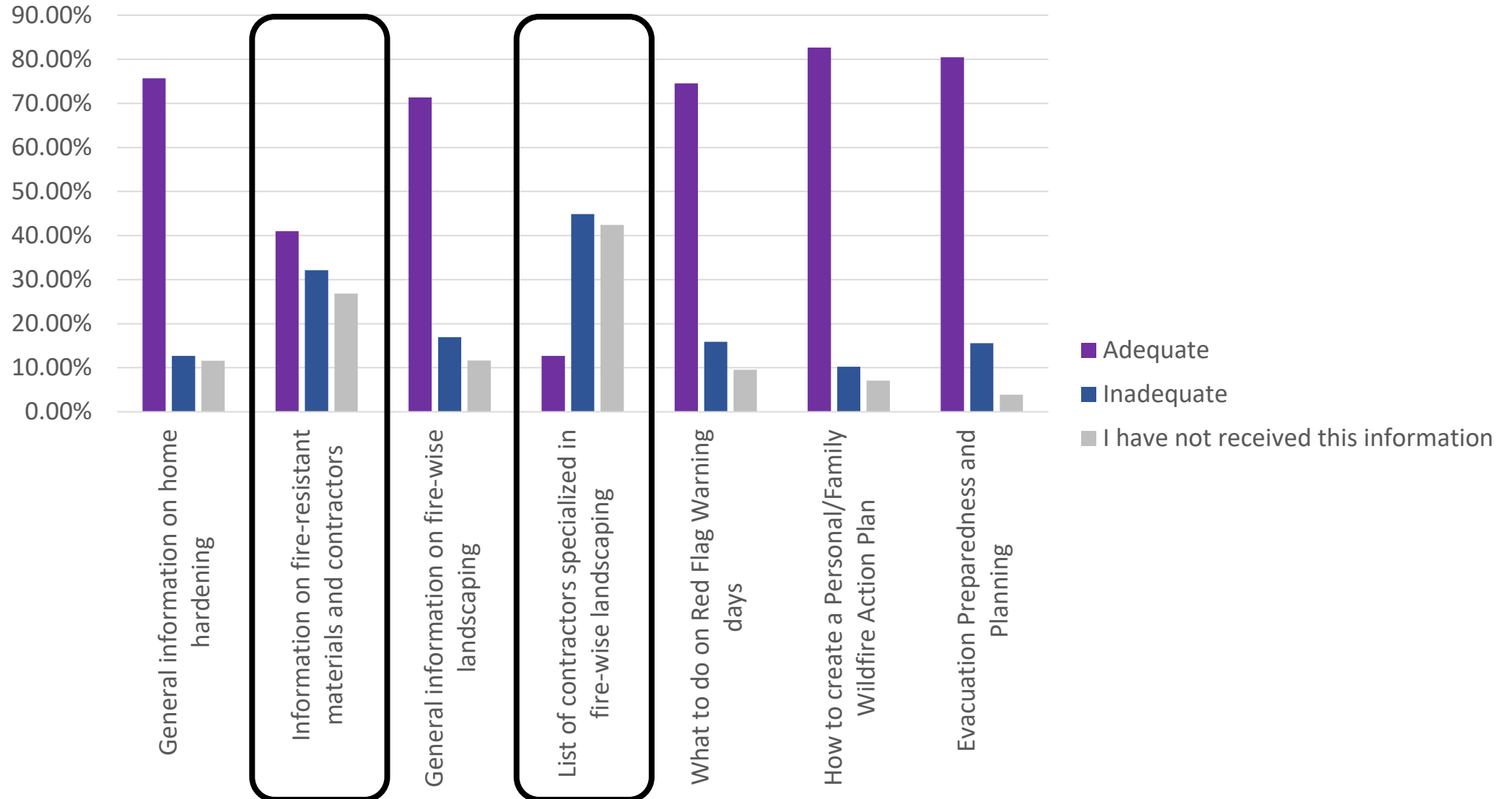

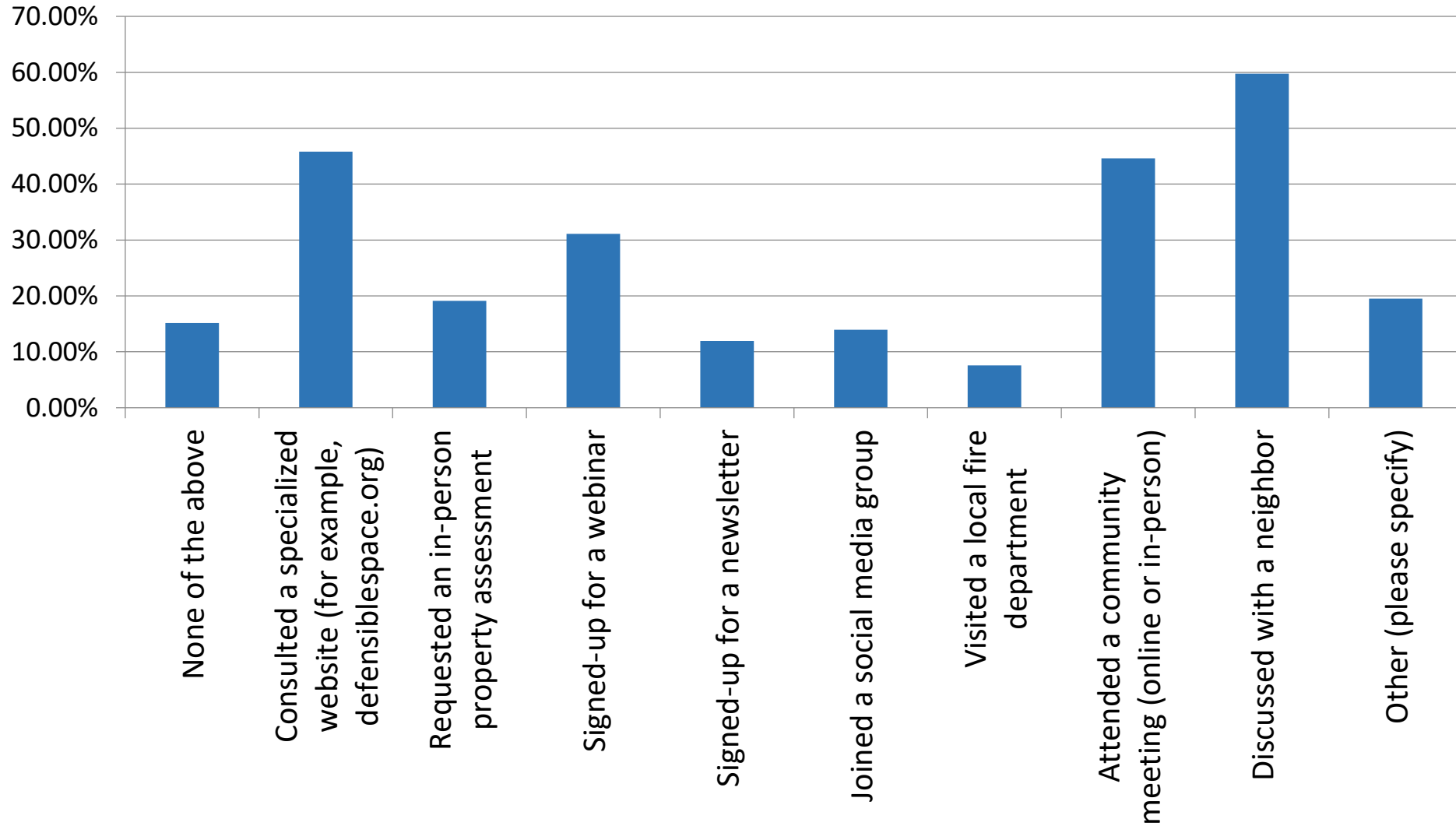

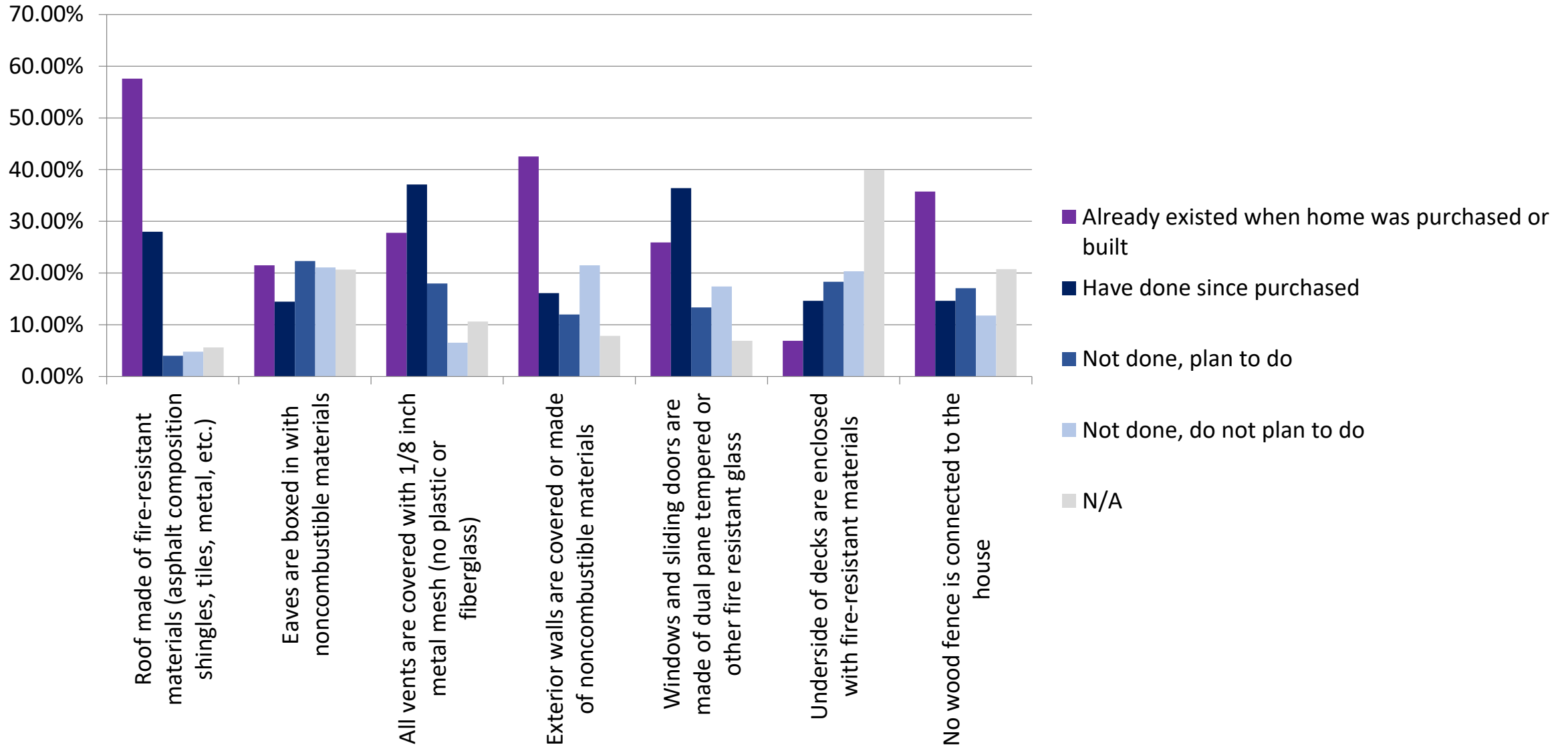
How would you evaluate the wildfire preparedness information that you have received? (N=284)



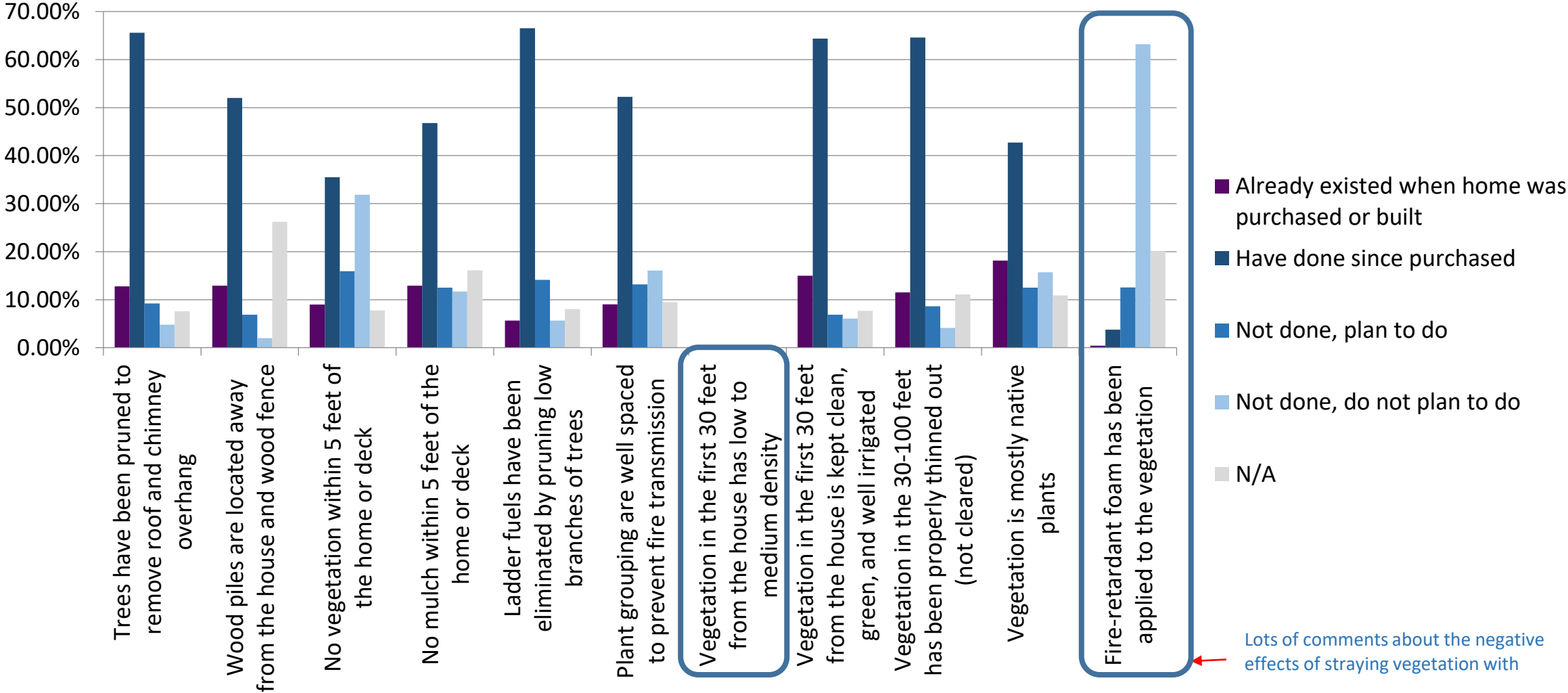
What actions have you recently taken (within the past 3 months) to increase your knowledge of wildfire preparedness? (check all that apply) (N=251)

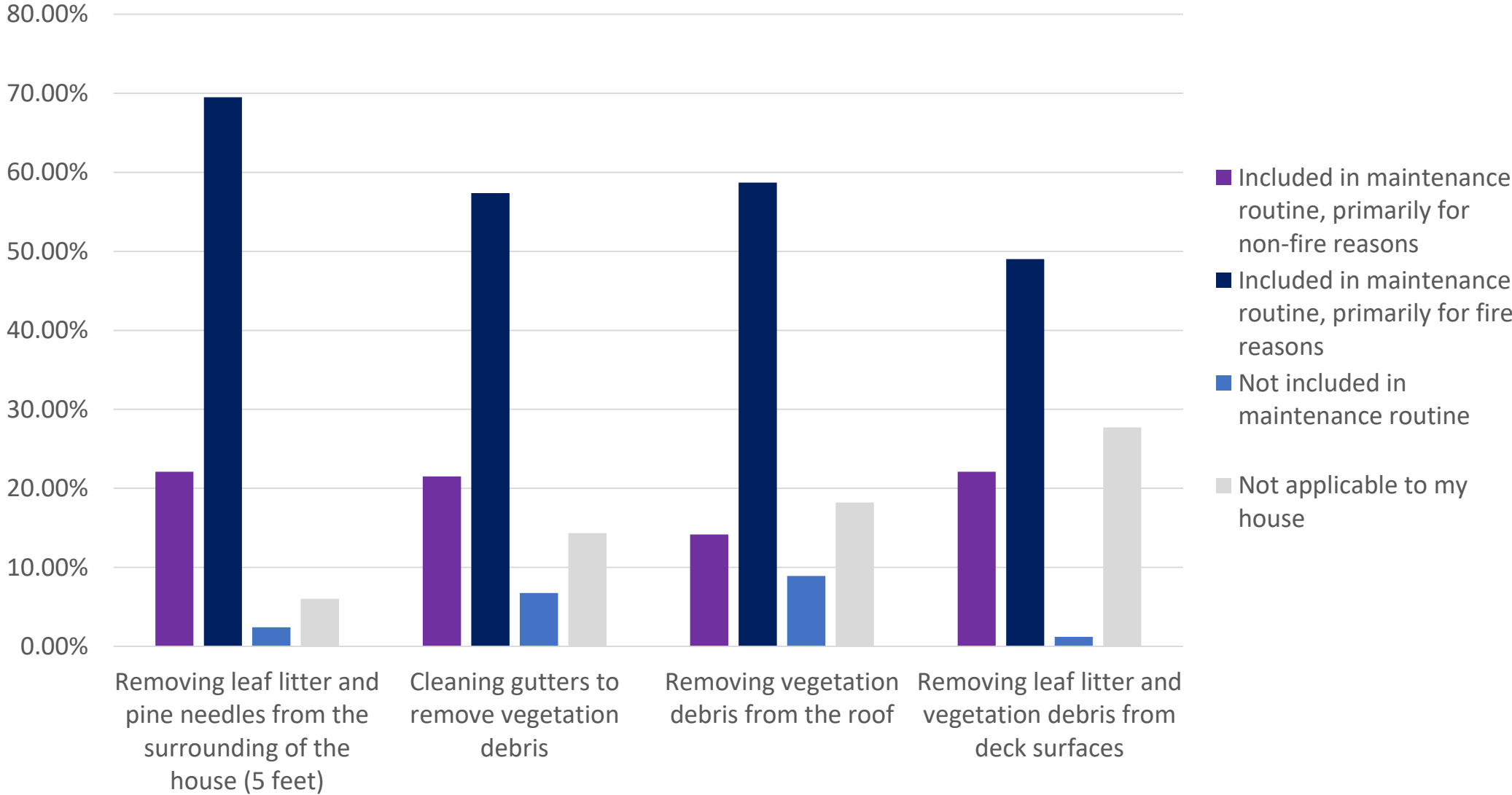

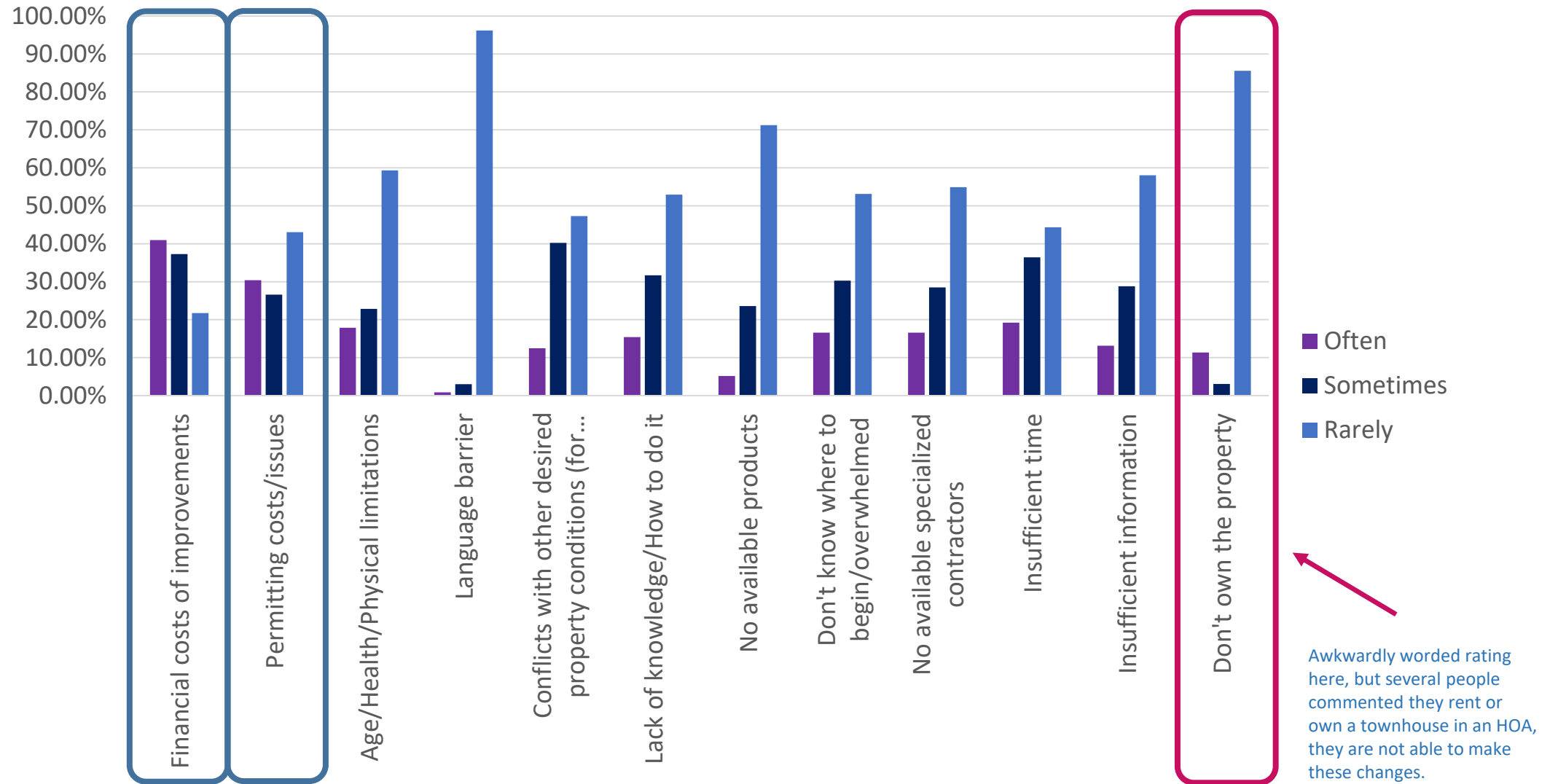

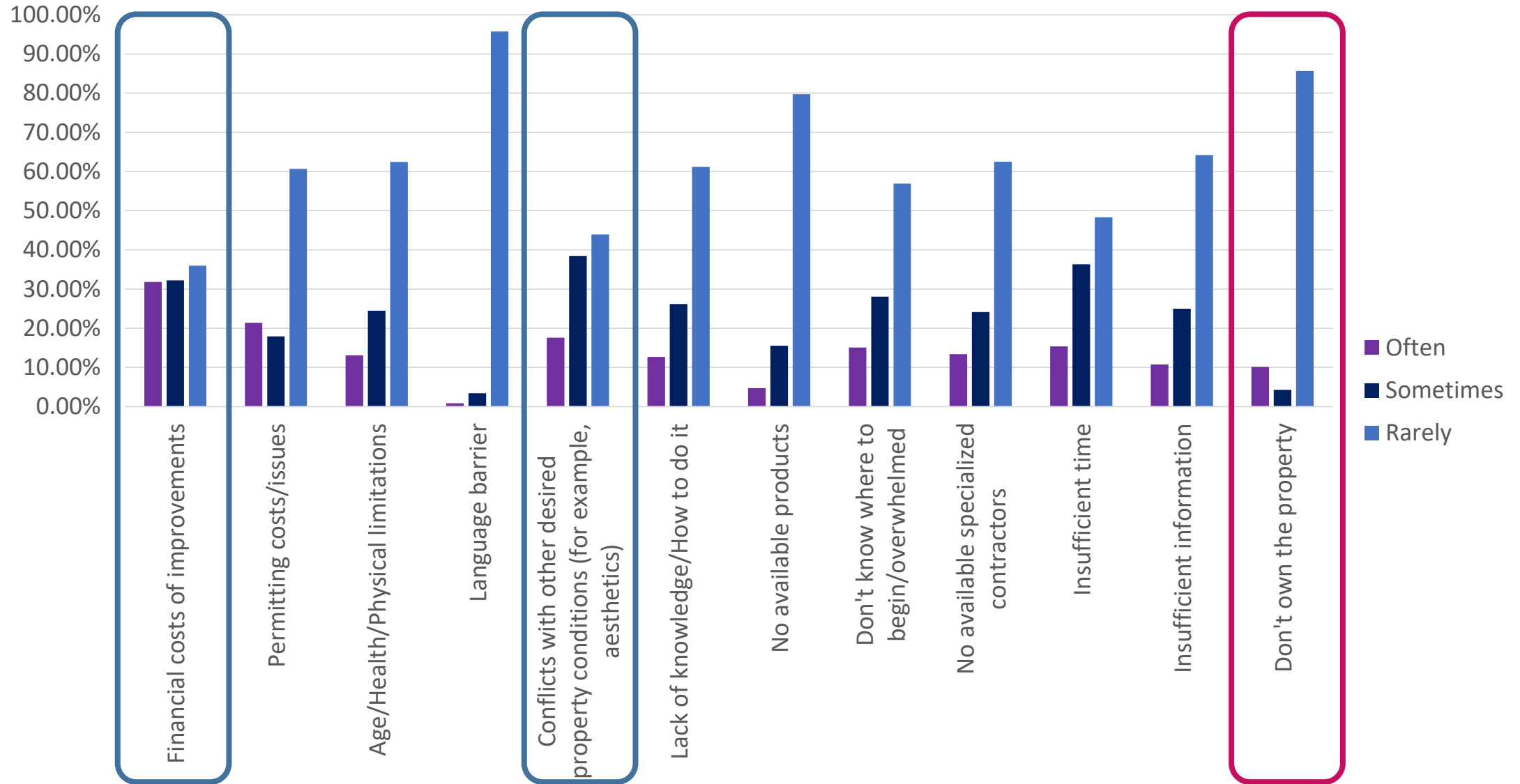
